PROGRAMNOTES

Kernkraft 400 was a record by German techno artist Zombie Nation and is very popular at sporting events, particularly in North America. According to multiple sources, it is believed to have been first used as the goal song for the Toronto Maple Leafs and the Boston Bruins. The version most widely known for sporting events was remixed to add the now-classic "Whoa-oh-oh" chant, also included in this arrangement.

The melody was originally composed as the theme for a video game called *Lazy Jones* that was played on the Commodore 64 computer. The original melody was composed by David Whittaker, entitled "Stardust," and the remixed version became an underground hit in all of the underground European clubs beginning around 1999. "Kernkraft (*Nuclear Energy* in German) 400" is often referred to as "Zombie Nation" due to its lyrics and has also been included in many sports video games.
