

Performance Notes

It is important that performers learning this arrangement know that this is an interpretation of a song most often (but not always) performed by jazz musicians in a medium or medium-up tempo with a swing feel. This treatment also utilizes reharmonization fairly extensively, meaning that the chord changes (included above the soprano part in this publication for reference) are different from the original. I would highly suggest that performers are directed to recordings of this song made by the ~~composer~~, George Shearing, as well as Sarah Vaughan, Ella Fitzgerald, and Mel Tormé, among many other greats.

A great stylistic reference for performing this arrangement would be any a cappella ballad performed by The Singers Unlimited. Notable is their use of straight tone, occasional airiness, and plenty of scooping into soprano notes to add emphasis to important words and syllables and emotion to the performance. I hope you enjoy making music with this arrangement!
