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Notes on "I Sing the Mighty Power of God"

Celebrating God's creation, this "hymn" was originally called "Praise for Creation and Providence" by the text writer, Isaac Watts. It is that creative power of God that surges forth in this dynamic arrangement which combines piano and organ in an extended prelude, with optional parts for both choir and handbells. The choir enters at the conclusion of this prelude for an optional choral introit. This festive setting is suitable for any worship celebration of praise.

Two keyboard parts are included in the score (removable by a center staple), along with reproducible parts for SATB choir. A separate 3-5 octave handbell score, arranged by Arnold B. Sherman, is available separately (Code 8195HB). Indications for the handbell entrances are included in the full score.
