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Program Notes

This exciting story should be a favorite of your men's chorus! The underlying question: how is the Captain going to deal with this sailor, who has ventured outside the rules of proper behavior on-board the ship?

The crew, upset as well, has a few suggestions. Be sure that the initial word, what, stands out. Each syllable must be sung detached, with "machine-gun" accuracy, so that no part of the text could be questioned by the listener. The bass/baritone part should release their opening portion of the phrase on the downbeat of the third measure that they sing. Every time there is an exchange between the voice parts, the pitch should be held until the other part enters. The phrase, "earli' in the mornin'", should be sung with a *crescendo*, each time. Suggestion: speak the text through several times before singing, for effective vocal production! If it's not too un-cool with the guys, I could see gesturing with clenched fists where appropriate! To me, it should be a great story!

Measures 47 through 52 should be sung freely, with no relation to structured meter. Why not a *cessura*, between each of the crew's suggestions? The last suggestion (measures 51 and 52), could be spoken, rather than sung, in exclamatory fashion, even by a soloist, who is totally exasperated!

Return to the metered ending with hushed tones, as if the sailors are whispering among themselves (some drama would help), so that the final *crescendo* is effective! I'm getting excited!! Please enjoy!
